oma Lodge is the largest lodge in California. At the time of this writing we have 281 members in the lodge. On May 25, 1930, 115 potential members of Roma Lodge came together to meet. Eight-six of those members were initiated and became charter members of the lodge on that day. The remaining 29 members were initiated at the following meeting. All of these individuals resided in Tulare County. Since that time we have welcomed members who lodges have closed. The Porterville Lodge and the Italia Nuova Lodge in Santa Barbara. How has the lodge membership changed in the last 94 years?

To begin with, 18 (6%) of our members live out of the state of California. 5 (2%) of our members live in Fresno County, 16 (6%) live in Kern County, 1 in Kings County, leaving about 80% living in Tulare County. 61 (22%) of our membership are Juniors and 21 (7%) are over the age of 80.

So what is the point? In the beginning of the lodge the primary purpose of the lodge was to bring Italian immigrants to the lodge and encourage them to become American Citizens. That mission is no longer the case. In fact of our 280 members we have only one Italian-American left in the lodge.

We also have many members who no longer live in Tulare County. Several live in Kern, Fresno or Kings County. The rest are located all over the state or in other states. These are descendants of some of our founding members who have continued their membership even though they live so far away it is impractical to come to meetings or participate in many of our activities. Because of health or age issues many members cannot attend meetings or activities.

The bottom line is if we get 50-60 member who help at the farm show or 60-80 members who attend monthly meetings the lodge is doing very well. We understand everyone cannot be active in the lodge, however we appreciate your membership.
